It was May of 2023 and a new beginning for Shelbie and her 12-year-old son Jayden. In 2016 Shelbie, a young mother, was in a car accident and experienced a traumatic brain injury. The doctors didn't know if she would survive and said that if she did, she would never walk again. But Shelbie is made of stronger stuff than they imagined. She not only pulled through but learned to walk with aid from a walker. During her long convalescence she and her young son moved home to live with her parents where they had to share her childhood bedroom. They wondered when and how they would be able to restart their lives in a home of their own.

Shelbie's dad had a longtime connection to Habitat for Humanity Montgomery County, Texas. In the organization's early years, he provided drywall for the homes. He knew that a Habitat home could be the solution for Shelbie and Jayden and that the community would be safe and welcoming. Before his untimely passing in 2021, he put his daughter in touch with Habitat and the rest, as they say, is history.



As a native Texan and one of six siblings, including a twin, Shelbie and Jayden had a lot of support to help with their 350 hours of sweat equity as they worked to build their new home alongside Habitat volunteers and neighbors in the community. Shelbie loved the experience.

Now that the small family is comfortably in their own home Shelbie continues to work on her physical recovery. Her next goal is to learn to drive so she can return to work and gain back all the independence she once had.

At Habitat we believe everyone, especially those who have served our country, deserves safe, decent, and affordable housing.

Steve and Barbara, an elderly couple in New Waverly, Texas, faced significant challenges with their aging home. Steve, an army veteran, has witnessed the significant wear and tear time has taken on their 50-year-old home.

The original roof was damaged and water seeped in, causing visible discoloration and mold growth in several rooms. The exterior of their home showed signs of aging, with damaged siding and openings to the crawlspace. The inside of the house was also in need of essential repairs. Sagging floors in the bathroom made the bathtub unstable. Water damage to the kitchen had ruined the cabinets, and an electrical issue affected the entire home. To

overcome the voltage fluctuations caused by the electrical problem, the family relied on extension cords, which created a potential fire hazard.

In the summer of 2022, Steve and Barbara learned that Habitat has a Veterans Build Initiative with funding to help build and repair homes for our nation's heroes. After contacting the organization, and completing a simple application, Habitat stepped in and embarked on a transformational journey. Stabilizing critical areas of the home, Habitat repaired the roof, kitchen, and bathroom. The electrical problems were resolved and the family's reliance on extension cords became a thing of the past.

This project was more than a physical renovation; it was a testament to the power of community and the resilience of a veteran and his spouse. Through the support of Habitat, Steve and Barbara's home has become a sanctuary once more, a place where hope and strength prevail.

over **1.3 million** pounds of goods diverted from the landfill




FY 2022-2023 financials

sources of funds - \$6.8 M*


